WORSHIP NOTES

Today's bulletin image is "Hope" by George Frederic Watts. In his discussion of Watts' painting in the book *Elusive Grace*, Rev. Dr. Scott Black Johnston writes, "...Watts depicted hope as a blinded woman in a tattered dress, perched atop a murky world. In her hands she holds a banged-up lyre. All of its strings have been broken — all except one. Hope could call it a day. Instead, she inclines her ear to the harp and reaches for that one remaining string." According to the Tate in London, "when the painting was first displayed in 1886, several critics argued that "Despair" would be a more fitting title. Watts clarified: 'Hope need not mean expectancy. It suggests here rather the music which can come from the remaining chord."

Children of all ages are welcome in the sanctuary during worship. Being present is how children learn to worship, so we welcome their wiggles and whispers. However, parents of small children may also drop off their Pre-K and younger kiddos in our nursery.
