WORSHIP NOTES

We welcome and thank this morning's guest organist, Dr. Michael Collier. Dr. Collier is an accomplished organist with degrees from The American Guild of Organists, and an award-winning dentist in Oakwood, GA.

Our bulletin image is *Anointing His Feet #2* by Wayne Forte. Forte was raised by a Filipino Catholic mother and an Irish Catholic father. He was touched by the biblical narratives of Gruenwald, Rubens, Rembrandt and Carravagio. After being educated to paint in the Modernist tradition, he longed for the passion for the spiritual and transcendent. He says "to be a religious painter in a secular age may seem, to many, anachronistic and narrow. Paradoxically, I have found that it satisfies my desire to portray the spiritual while transcending Modernism's self-centeredness."
