WORSHIP NOTES

We welcome Pastor Nibs Stroupe today as worship leader and preacher. Rev. Stroupe was ordained in 1975 and he and his spouse Caroline Leach were the first clergy couple in the Southern Presbyterian Church, beginning in Norfolk, Virginia. They were co-pastors of Oakhurst Presbyterian in Decatur for over 30 years before retiring. Rev. Stroupe co-authored with Dr. Catherine Meeks the award-winning book *Passionate for Justice: Ida B. Wells as Prophet for Our Time* and is author of 5 other books, including a memoir which will be published this year. In 2007, Rev. Stroupe was inducted into the Morehouse Martin Luther King Jr. College of Preachers. Nibs and Caroline have two children, David and Susan, and two granddaughters.

This week our congregation is worshiping in two locations. In addition to our service here this morning, a group of DHPCers is in Montreat, NC at our congregational retreat. We are grateful to be worshiping with you in whatever way you join us!

Our Call to Worship and Prayer of Brokenness come from Lavon Bayler's *Gathered by Love*. Bayler notes that each Sunday we are gathered by love to sit at the feet of Jesus. Then "we are sent back to our everyday world to share love, not as a sentimental feeling but in caring actions."
