Using the Gospel of Luke and interweaving the birth of Christ with the parallel of Elizabeth, Zechariah, and John the Baptist, the creators of the series “saw the full scope of human emotions: isolation, fear, disbelief, as well as connection, trust, and joy. We acknowledged that the Christmas season is often an emotionally-charged time when we feel many things deeply—sometimes all at once.” So, this Advent, we hold space for our weariness *and* our joy. Today’s Bulletin image is *Surrogacy* by Hannah Garrity, inspired by Luke 2:1-20. Garrity writes that “in this painting, Black Mother God has asked her daughter Mary to hold the role of surrogate for the pregnancy of infant Creator. Mary has carried the child to term. She has given birth. God embraces Mary as well as the Holy Infant in gratitude. For without Mary’s surrogacy, the incarnation could not be.”
