WORSHIP NOTES

In recognition of Black History Month, we will be intentionally using songs composed, written, and/or arranged by Black artists throughout February. Our doxology for each week will be "Lift Every Voice and Sing" often called "The Black National Anthem." It was originally written as a poem by NAACP leader James Weldon Johnson in 1900. His brother, John Rosamond Johnson, composed the music. It was first performed at the segregated elementary school in Jacksonville, Florida where James Weldon Johnson was principal.

Children of all ages are welcome in the sanctuary during worship. Being present is how children learn to worship, so we welcome their wiggles and whispers. However, parents of small children may also drop off their Pre-K and younger kiddos in our nursery. We also hope children will take advantage of the PrayGround, which is in the back of the sanctuary and offers room to move, color, and participate in worship in a kid friendly spot.

In the early hours of February 6, a 7.8 magnitude earthquake struck near the Turkey-Syria border. This earthquake is estimated to have caused the death of over 16,000 people and will have long-lasting effects on more than 23 million people. PBG focuses on advocating for policies that are consistent with the ministries of PC(USA) churches; particularly, legislation that will create stronger mental health care services, dedicate more state resources towards affordable housing; and fund tested, proven strategies for moving people out of homelessness.
