Today's bulletin image is *Lift Off* by Rev. Nicolette Peñaranda. Inspired by Matthew 14:22-23, Peñaranda says, "In *Lift Off*, the elements are like main characters, inspiring whimsical fantasy. Cut-out layered clouds build into the horizon of the sea. The forceful wind tunnel blows over the sinking foot of a probably panicking Peter. This is a moving piece that is meant to tell a story in any direction it is turned."

YOUR VOICE IS NEEDED: PROTECT THE OKEFENOKEE!

For five years environmentalist groups, including Georgia Interfaith Power and Light, have been fighting to stop strip mining near the Okefenokee Swamp. This fight has reached a critical stage! Earlier this month, Georgia's Environmental Protection Division (EPD) issued draft permits for Twin Pines, LLC to mine titanium along Trail Ridge—a vital barrier protecting this sacred place! Experts agree that mining in this location will threaten the swamp's water levels, increase wildfire risks, harm wildlife, and release toxic contaminants. Advocates (you!) have just a few weeks to make as much noise as possible to stop this development. Please take a moment to call on Gov.
