Dedicating Our Gifts to Combating Racism

We fixed racial discrimination in the '60s when the Civil Rights Act of 1965 was passed, didn't we? Well, no, we didn't. Laws may have been passed to protect Black citizens but long-standing biases against them have continued to prevail. These biases are at the heart of systemic racism and the poverty and oppression it creates. During Black History Month let us focus on opportunities to learn the truth and to better discern how we may each be called to make amends. As Pastor Betsy says, "When we know better, we do better."

The Presbyterian Mission Agency (PMA) website is a valuable resource for learning about the historical role our denomination played in the slavery debate, as well as current Matthew 25 initiatives to dismantle systemic racism. Most recently, PMA has created the Presbyterian Center for Repair of Historical Harms, which will be led by Rev. Anthony Jermaine Ross-Allum, a former PC(USA) pastor for Social Justice. In recognition of Black History Month, we will be intentionally using songs composed, written, and/or arranged by Black artists throughout February. Our doxology for each week will be "Lift Every Voice and Sing" often called "The Black National Anthem." It was originally written as a poem by NAACP leader James Weldon Johnson in 1900. His brother, John Rosamond Johnson, composed the music. It was first performed at the segregated elementary school in Jacksonville, Florida where James Weldon Johnson was principal.

The bulletin image is *Sermon on the Mount*, part of the Vie de Jesus Mafa ("The Life of Jesus Mafa") project, an initiative undertaken in the 1970s to help teach the gospel in Northern Cameroon. French Catholic missionary François Vidil worked with Mafa Christian communities in Cameroon to dramatically interpret biblical scenes, and then convert those dramatizations into an enormous catalog of paintings depicting the life of Jesus as an African man.
