**Earth Stewardship Invitation:** Wash your clothes less frequently. A quarter of the carbon footprint of a garment comes from the way we care for it post-purchase. On top of that, 90% of our clothing is thrown away long before it needs to be, due to our culture of 'fast fashion' and outdated laundry habits. For example, blue jeans can be worn ten times before needing to be washed. Other ideas to consider: try zero waste laundry detergent, line dry your clothes, stop buying dryer sheets and use dryer balls, and use a Guppy Bag to stop microplastics.

**Today's bulletin image**, *Beseeching*, by Hannah Garrity was inspired by Matthew 16:21-23. The artist writes, "In this text, I feel Jesus speaking directly to me: 'You are a hindrance to me, for you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things' (Matthew 16:23). This is exactly where frustration surfaces for me.... It is when I have set my eye on human things. So why am I so focused on human things? And the negative ones, at that? Because I'm human. Because these things matter. But not if I miss the grandeur of... the expansive love of God!"
