WORSHIP NOTES

This Lent (Sunday, February 18 - Sunday, March 31) DHPC will explore the Sanctified Art series "Wandering Heart." We will be "focusing on the life and faith of one of Jesus' most famous disciples. In Peter, we see a person who is both steadfast and unsteady, a dear friend and a betrayer, a follower and a wanderer... we often see ourselves." Join us over these weeks as we follow this disciple and his relationship with Jesus and ponder how this story can be comforting to us as our journey seems to wander rather than continue in a straight line. Today's bulletin image, *Seventy-seven Times*, by Rev. Lauren Wright Pittman was inspired by Matthew 18:15-22. The artist writes, "In this mandala, I wanted to follow a person through the process of reproval, forgiveness, reconciliation, and restoration as Jesus describes in Matthew 18. In the center, a person is standing alone, isolated, with their arms crossed in a closed-off posture. If you're sinned against, Jesus says to go and 'point out the fault when the two of you are alone' (Matthew 18:15). When you move to the second ring of the mandala, there are pairs of people shaking hands, finding common ground, or at least attempting to. If this doesn't work, then you are to bring more people together to provide counsel and witness. In the third ring of the mandala, two people are engaging with the closed-off person, sharing a way forward. In the next ring hyacinth flowers—which represent sorrow, regret, and forgiveness—stretch, bloom, and grow, bringing beauty into the now open arms of the people in the last ring of the mandala, who are embraced and woven into the community. The person from the center goes from being alone and closed-off to embraced and open."

Children of all ages are welcome in the sanctuary during worship. Being present is how children learn to worship, so we welcome their wiggles and whispers. However, parents of small children may also drop off their Pre-K and younger kiddos in our nursery. We also hope children will take advantage of the PrayGround, which is in the back of the sanctuary and offers room to move, color, and participate in worship in a kid friendly spot.

Assisted Listening Devices are available from our ushers for anyone who needs hearing assistance.

Interested in membership? We are so grateful for the visitors (old and new) who add to our community each week. If you are interested in learning more about what it would look like to join, it's really easy; just talk with one of our pastors. They'll answer questions you may have about DHPC or Presbyterianism, and walk you through meeting our leadership and making your spot in our family official. DESIGNATED PASTOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE UPDATE

There are 5 phases that must be completed in this process of selecting DHPC's designated pastor. Phase 1, meeting with Presbytery Consultant Rev. Joy Fisher, is complete. Phase 2, the DPNC's current phase, involves editing the previously developed Minister Information Form, so that the picture that DHPC presents to applicants is clear and up to date. Once complete, the MIF will be approved by Presbytery and the DHPC Session. DHPC ONCE AGAIN NAMED AN EARTH CARE CONGREGATION

Great news! DHPC has been re-certified as an Earth Care Congregation for the fifth year in a row! The Presbyterian Church uses this program to recognize congregations that commit to earth care in the areas of worship, education, facilities, and outreach. Certification is obtained by taking actions such as having environmentally focused services or sermons, outdoor classes for youth, replacing incandescent light bulbs with LEDs, and having church-sponsored recycling days and nature hikes.
