- **Bulletin art** is "Renacimiento," a Conté crayon, charcoal, acrylic, and gold gild piece by Carmelle Beaugelin. Inspired in part by the Spanish-speaking Pentecostal church in Miami called "Renacimiento" in which the artist was raised, this piece depicts "a metaphorically disrobed, aging, and vulnerable Nicodemus, surrounded by the milky gray swirls of water and spirit, wondering: How can this be?"

SUPPORT PRESBYTERIAN DISASTER ASSISTANCE'S EARTHQUAKE RESPONSE

In the early hours of February 6, a 7.8 magnitude earthquake struck near the Turkey-Syria border. This earthquake is estimated to have caused the death of over 40,000 people and will have long-lasting effects on more than 23 million people. PDA is making solidarity grants to partner organizations working to meet immediate needs such as distributing winterization items, food items, and medicines.
