UNISON PRAYER OF BROKENNESS

God of all things, each week we gather and pray the prayer that Jesus taught us to pray, beginning with the words, "Our Father..."

We confess, though, that each week we forget that you are our loving parent who continues to create and move in this world.

Jesus told us that you are "...in heaven...,"
yet we fail to live in wonder of your holiness.
We take you for granted,
and are blind to the awesome beauty
of the little heavens here among us.

We pray, "Hallowed be your name...," but our awe of you is too small to lead us to care reverently for your earth, sky, and sea.

We pray, "Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven..." but we put our own interests first--exploiting your creation and living for our own convenience and self-interest.

We pray, "Give us this day our daily bread," but we consume more than our share and watch silently while vibrant lives turn dull due to the lack of resources.

We pray, "Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us," yet we consider these words only in spiritual terms and think nothing about the real physical hurt we inflict on the seas and swamps, the birds and bats, the mountains and molehills.

We pray, "Lead us not into temptation," yet we regularly fall prey to the desire to spend more, use more, acquire more, and waste more.

We pray, "Deliver us from evil..." yet we often act from greed and self-centeredness, causing separation from you and others.

We pray, "For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever." Help us to know that in caring for your good creation, we are working for your kingdom, being careful stewards of your creative power, and giving you glory.
