Dedicating our Gifts to Combating Racism

Gun violence is a racial justice issue. Gun homicides (mass shootings, so-called "everyday" violence, and police-involved shootings) are a universal American threat. But Black Americans are 10 times more likely than white Americans to die from gun violence. And Black youth fare even worse. Black children and teens are 14 times

more likely to die from gun homicide than their white counterparts. And yet, the U.S. largely ignores the external, systemic factors driving inequality and violence in Black neighborhoods. We must consider how these factors plus public policy have made it so that Black people are more likely to face conditions that facilitate gun violence. 
