Earth Stewardship Invitation: Reduce your shower time! Conserving water is crucial and we cannot continue to mindlessly waste it. The simple act of reducing shower time by only 2 minutes will save about 4 gallons of water, resulting in as many as 1,460 gallons of water per year. In addition to helping the earth, you'll save money. Fulton County's Board of Commissioners approved a series of 5% increases in combined water and sewer rates, effective January 1 with additional increases on January 1, 2024, and January 1, 2025.

SECURITY UPDATE

As a best practice to maintain security on campus, we will soon be resetting the church door keycards and codes that have been issued over the years to members of the church community. So, what does this mean for you?

1. If you have a key code and/or card, be aware that those will soon stop working.

2. Please turn in physical keycards ASAP to one of the pastors, to Mike Williams, or in one of the offering boxes.

3. After this security reset, we encourage church members to get back to accessing the church during office hours (ordinarily 9-1, Monday-Thursday) or by appointment with a staff person or other card/code holder. If you feel you will need a card or code for access at other times, please contact one of the pastors to discuss.

PASTORAL TRANSITION UPDATE

As DHPC goes through the steps to call our next installed pastor, updates will be shared here. <u>Where we are:</u> Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) has been prayerfully reviewing candidates and narrowing down by conducting interviews, listening to sermons, and checking references. Thank you, congregation, for doing a great job praying for them and respecting the confidentiality of the process! <u>What comes next and what you can do</u>: Once the PNC identifies their candidate, they will ask the Session to call a congregational meeting for you to receive their report, hear about the person, and vote on calling them as your pastor. Until then, keep praying for the PNC and all candidates, including the one who will be your new pastor.
