Bulletin art is "Stephen" by Gracie Morbitzer of The Modern Saints (themodernsaints.com). This artist offers powerful contemporary interpretations of the saints, "painted with character, correct age and ethnicity, and modern style to show how human they were: how amazing, and how just like us." Of this particular piece, she writes, "Since martyrs are so often pictured with their method of murder, I chose to portray Stephen with a more modern form of "stones" pictured on his sweatshirt. His eyes are raised to his vision of heaven, though he looks afraid - he did not have any previous martyrs to give him the strength and courage to endure his torture and death as all future martyrs did."

RESTORED ORGAN INSTALLATION – GOOD NEWS!

At long last, we are thrilled to announce that the installation of our restored pipe organ has begun! A crew from the A. E. Schlueter Pipe Organ Company came Thursday, July 13 to deliver some of the restored components and began preparing the Swell and Choir chambers to receive that portion of the organ. That included removing some original, now obsolete, electrical wiring. Much of this past week was spent installing components that supply the wind pressure for the Swell pipes, a few of which might start arriving by the end of this week. Installation of organ components will continue for several weeks but, since it is behind those gold façade pipes, the progress will be mostly invisible to the congregation. The project experienced extended, unexpected delays, almost entirely caused by the Covid pandemic and its effects on labor, health, manufacturing parts, and deliveries. But, as Arthur Schlueter put it, the candle of installation has been lit!
